How To Make A Pride Bracelet for the ELCA National Youth Gathering

You'll need:

- Colorful beads (any variety will do: seed, pony, heishi, etc.)
- Stretchy elastic cord (a size that fits your beads!)
- Letter beads (optional, any color is fine)
- Accent beads (optional: metallic pearls, shells, shapes, etc.)
- Painter's tape (optional but helpful)
- 1. Measure 6 to 7.5 inches on a piece of painter's tape or measure-keeping device, laying it on the surface in front of you.
- 2. Lay your beads along the painter's tape to make sure that your design will fit the wrist size you've chosen. It can help to do this in a shoebox lid, the groove of a ruler, or something with a ridge that will help keep the beads from rolling or sliding.
- 3. Start sliding your beads onto the elastic cord. You can leave the cord attached to the roll to prevent double knotting or pre-cutting your sections of the cord, leaving plenty of extra length to knot the end.
- 4. Once all the beads are on, grab both ends of the cord and tie them off like a water balloon.
- 5. Make sure to give a couple of quick tugs on the accord to secure the knot.
- 6. Trim the ends if necessary.
- 7. (optional) If you have large enough beads, you can cover the knot with a large bead.

Tips:

Not every bracelet has to be the same. If you have accent beads, have fun with them!

Patterns can repeat all the way around or be framed with a single color, usually black or white.

If you choose to have text, please keep the words appropriate. "Beloved" is a word that will work no matter the pride flag choice.
